The Peoria Sports Complex is nothing if not a trend-setter. Built on what was once barren desert land, it was the first spring training facility designed to be shared by two teams. The stadium also had the dual purpose of becoming the economic catalyst for development in Peoria. It was very successful in that regard and all new Cactus League projects since have followed Peoria's two-team complex blueprint.
